You will need to have a copy of your SAT or ACT scores and your latest high school transcript in order to complete the questions on the online application.

HISTORY

The Black Student Alliance at Yale (BSAY) was formed in 1967 in response to an urgent need for collective action to counter injustice and a desire to address the issues facing black students. During an era when Black Americans were prescribed to second-class citizenship, BSAY campaigned heavily on behalf of people of African descent at Yale. Today, BSAY is a multi-cultural organization dedicated to enhancing the lives of black students at Yale and beyond through political action, community action, and social events.

Understanding that the world changes for the better through the determined efforts of concerned people, and that we are strongest when we are united, BSAY exists in order to create that unity and foster that change in hopes of furthering the cause of equality. As a student-run organization, BSAY is responsible for advocating for the students at Yale, taking political stands, and creating the sense of community necessary to unite students to work for positive change.

PURPOSE

This year, as a part of our year-long "First Steps, Second Chances" campaign, BSAY will award a \$1000 one-time scholarship to a New Haven student that has either been previously incarcerated or has had a parent who has been incarcerated. We believe that everyone deserves a second chance, and in that spirit, we must provide opportunities our fellow citizens. The scholarship will be awarded in April, at BSAY's 45th Anniversary Dinner.

Through the "First Steps, Second Chances" campaign, we hope to address the problems within our broken criminal justice system. Over 2.3 million people in the United States are currently under correctional control – whether incarcerated, on probation, or on parole. This number has steadily increased since 1971, and is unusually high compared to other developed nations. When they are released, people, and too often people of color, cannot shake the enduring stigma of a criminal record, making it extremely difficult to find gainful employment or housing. We hope to do our part as a community to break this vicious cycle through pointed advocacy and community engagement.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants for the "First Steps, Second Chances" Scholarship **MUST**:

- Have been previously incarcerated and/or have a parent that has been previously incarcerated
- Be a graduating senior in high school (enrolling in college Fall 2012) or current college freshman
- Have maintained a 2.5 GPA or higher, or provide documentation explaining circumstances if GPA is lower than 2.5.
- Attend school or live in New Haven, CT
- Demonstrate financial need
- Be able to attend BSAY 45th Anniversary Dinner on **April 7th, 2012**

The scholarship does not discriminate on the basis of race, age, gender, religion or sexuality. All information provided by the applicant will be kept strictly confidential and will not be released to any third parties.
